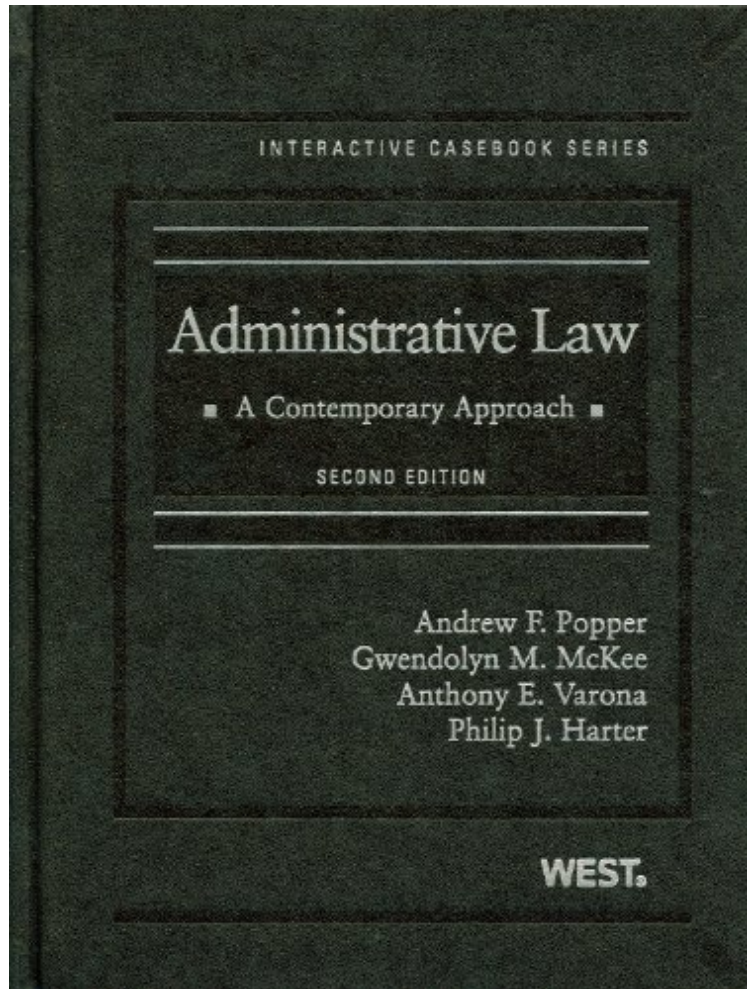

The sections are broken up almost in an outline format, and nearly half of the text (outside the main cases) is questions. I don't want more questions, I want answers! Moreover, the book is poorly structured. I have learned infinitely more from the Admin Law Emanuel.
