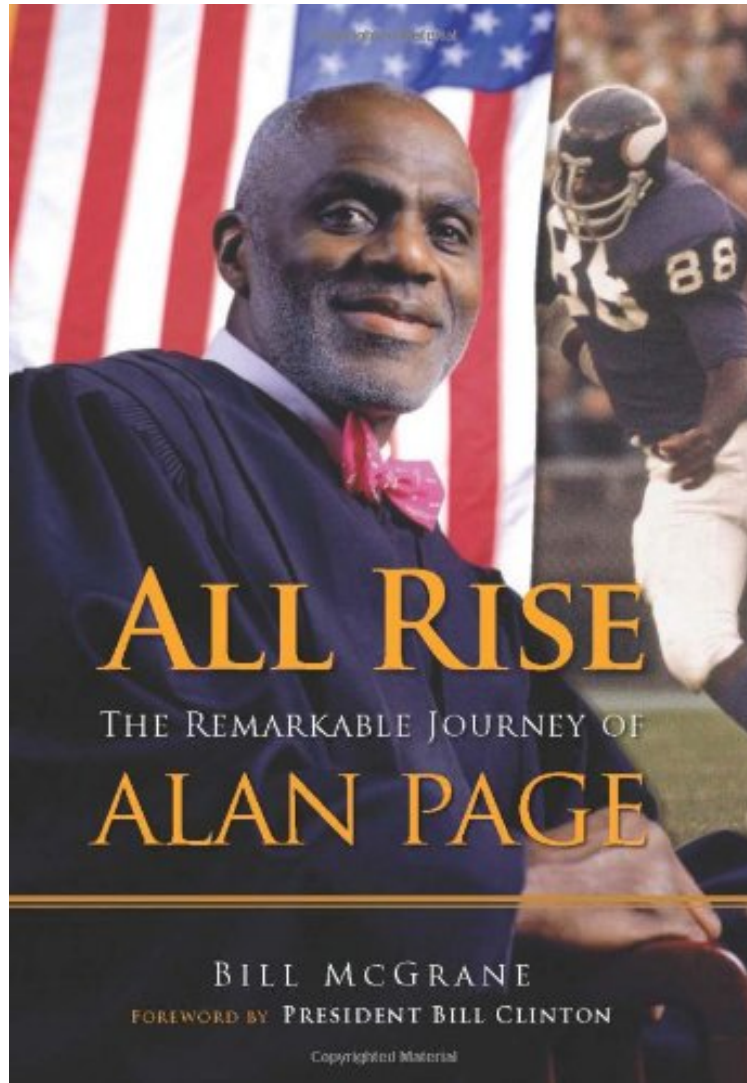

He couldn't have picked a more appropriate subject to apply that style to than Alan Page, as good a role model as professional American sports has ever produced. Justice Page's life is remarkable on so many levels -- from athletic achievement to the law and then philanthropy. McGrane's book documents each of them in a quiet, measured but effective style -- much like the subject whom he's writing about.I saw Alan Page play during his entire career -- and there really was nobody like him either before or since. Late

in his career he couldn't have weighed more than 225 pounds -- yet still routinely defeated blockers much larger than that by using intelligence and instincts. Those attributes obviously served him well after his playing days -- and they are illustrated in full throughout this book. Football fans will love the recollections of NFL players from the past. I was happy when I received a good mark on my exam but in the course of finding my exam book I saw Alan's. He received a lower mark but still a very respectable effort. I was in awe that this guy who was such a talent on the football field and a genuinely nice guy could also do so well in a course that I struggled with while also being a football star. All Rise is the authorized biography of Alan Page, a remarkable man who became a pioneer for his race without setting out to be one. He grew up in Canton, Ohio, in the shadow of the Pro Football Hall of Fame, into which he would later be inducted after his stellar NFL career. After leading Notre Dame to a national championship in 1966 and earning All-America honors, he became a first-round draft choice of the Minnesota Vikings in 1967. A six-time All-Pro for the Vikings, where he led the team to four conference titles, he was named the NFL's MVP in 1971, the first defensive player to be so honored. After retiring and being elected in the NFL Hall of Fame, Page went on to graduate from the University of Minnesota Law School and to become a justice on the Minnesota Supreme Court. This stirring biography takes a detailed look at a truly influential and remarkable man.
