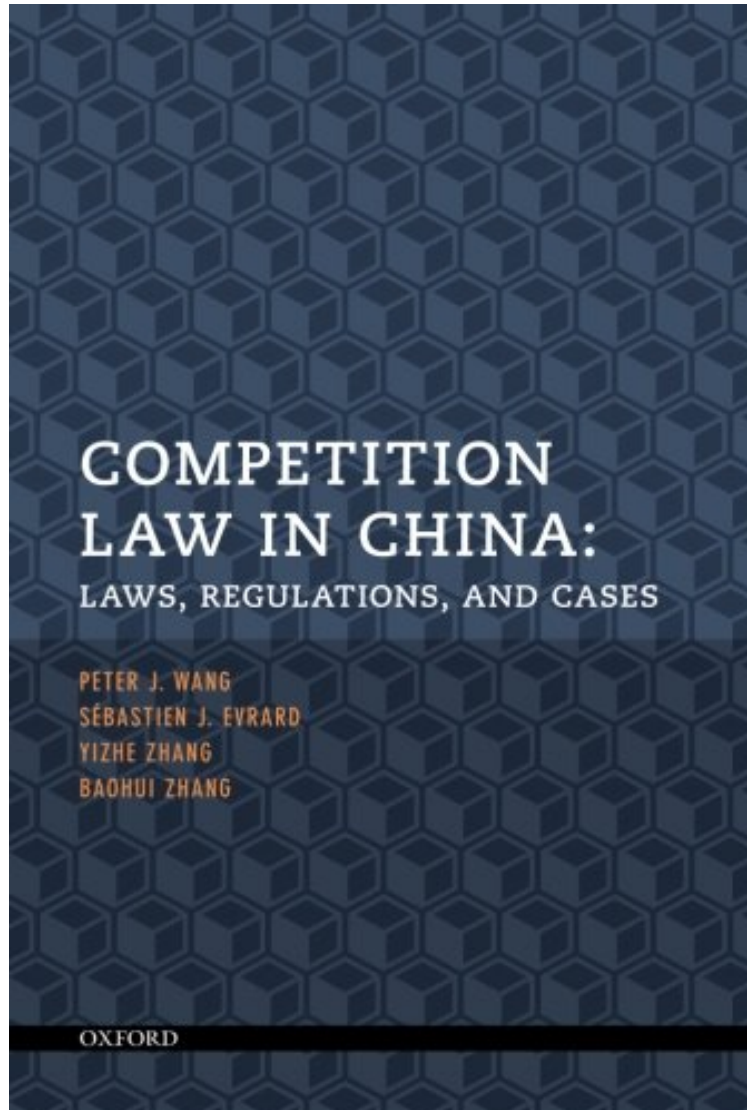


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Competition Law in China: Laws, Regulations, and Cases
